

Bio for Terry F. Liercke, Regional Director, Audubon at Home in Northern Virginia

After a 25-year career in the U.S. Foreign Service with the Agency for International Development, Mr. Liercke's longstanding interest in nature and the environment led to over ten years of federal, state, and local service, both as a volunteer and employee in Northern Virginia parks and conservation organizations. He is a Virginia Master Naturalist, and recent past president of the Audubon Society of Northern Virginia, an all-volunteer-driven, non-profit with an office at the National Wildlife Federation headquarters in Reston.

Audubon at Home in Northern Virginia operates in Arlington, Alexandria, Fairfax, Prince William and Loudoun counties. Audubon has volunteer coordinators in each jurisdiction who respond to homeowners, schools, businesses and other property owners interested in certifying their properties as Audubon at Home Wildlife Sanctuaries that meet specific healthy environmental criteria. Mr. Liercke helped initiate the certification program and has led its implementation since 2010. Mr. Liercke is a member of the leadership team for the Fairfax County Restoration Project.
